



Rachel G. Klein, Ph.D. - Biography

Rachel G. Klein, Ph.D., has been an active researcher in child psychiatry for several decades. She has conducted large scale investigations of the treatment of children with Attention Deficit/Hyperactivity Disorder, Learning Disorders, Anxiety Disorders and Depression. Her longitudinal studies have documented the importance of early diagnosis, treatment, and prevention of childhood psychiatric disorders.

Dr. Klein has participated actively in the development of childhood psychiatric diagnoses. She was a contributor to the *Diagnostic Statistical Manuals, DSM-III, DSM-III R, DSM-IV*, and is now a contributor to the *DSM-V* edition, due in 2013. She has mentored many of our nation's leading researchers in child and adolescent mental health.

Dr. Klein is a recipient of the prestigious Ruane Prize for Research in Child and Adolescent Psychiatry of the National Alliance for Research on Schizophrenia and Depression, and a National Institute of Mental Health Merit Award recipient. She has been elected an Honorary Fellow of the American Psychiatric Association.
