



Diane McIntosh, M.D. - Biography

Dr. McIntosh graduated from Dalhousie University in Halifax, where she completed an undergraduate degree in pharmacy before completing her medical residency (two years pediatrics and then psychiatry). She is a clinical assistant professor at the University of British Columbia, has a busy private practice and clinical research program, and is consultant psychiatrist for the Vancouver Association of Survivors of Torture.

As a researcher, Dr. McIntosh has been a principle or sub-investigator in many clinical trials (phase II-IV), both industry sponsored and investigator initiated, and is the author of numerous papers. She has a particular interest in the neurobiology of mood and anxiety disorders. She is frequently an invited lecturer at local, national and international conferences on topics related to mood, anxiety and ADHD. She sits on the executive of the Canadian ADHD Resource Alliance (CADDRA).
